Moribana means "piled up." This type of arrangement is in a shallow container or dish. A kenzan (pin holder) is used to hold the plant material.





Placement of the 3 main lines showing the 3-D character





- 1. Measure container with shin branch. Diameter plus height.
- 2. Measure and cut shin 1 ½ to 2 x container size.
- 3. Measure and cut soe 34 of shin.
- 4. Measure and cut flower ¾ to ½ of soe.
 - 5. Place kenzan in the left front of the container.
 - 6. Insert shin near the back of kenzan, leaning to the left and forward 15°.
 - 7. Insert soe on the left side of the kenzan leaning down 45° and coming forward 45°.
 - 8. Insert hikae on the right side of kenzan leaning down 75° and coming forward 45°.
 - 9. Add **jushi**. One branch behind shin, one or two more flowers (all shorter than hikae) And fern to hide the kenzan.
